Central County Fire Supports Sonoma, Napa Suppression Efforts

On Monday, October 9, at 2:30 a.m., the Central County Fire Department (CCFD) deployed personnel and several fire apparatus to support fire suppression and relief efforts for the North Bay Fires. The fire, which started Sunday night around 9:45 p.m., has burned tens of thousands of acres and destroyed entire housing and commercial developments. Currently, more than 6000 personnel and more than a 1000 pieces of equipment from multiple agencies are supporting firefighting and relief efforts.



"Napa and Sonoma are being ravaged by fires and we are doing everything we can to help get people to safety," said CCFD Chief John Kammeyer. "Unfortunately, high winds and dense, dry vegetation are fueling this fire. Suppression crews are working to create defensive barriers around residential and commercial properties until they can get in and fight the fire."

Hillsborough Police Department - North Bay Fire Update

On Monday, October 9, 2017, at 5:16 a.m., California Office of Emergency Services requested mutual aid for the Santa Rosa Police Department and the Napa County Sheriff's Office to assist with evacuations and road closure traffic control as a result of the North Bay Fires. A unit of 50 officers from San Mateo County police agencies responded and will continue mutual aid support



through Monday, October 16 and likely beyond. The Hillsborough Police Department has provided Officers per operational period who have been assigned to victim search operations, maintaining traffic posts, and looter suppression. Our officers are working with officers from all over Northern California in this mutual aid operation and are doing everything possible to provide safety and security to residents of Sonoma and Napa Counties. Some of our deployed officers have driven back and forth from HPD to the North Bay deployment areas following their shifts while other teams have been required to rent rooms due to physical fatigue.
