



Peace Officers Memorial Day and National Police Week

The City Council issued a proclamation officially observing the week of May 13 to 19 as National Police Week and also May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day. Police Chief Mark O'Connor presented the proclamation to Officer Dana Tandy who accepted on the Department's behalf.


Flags were flown at half-staff on Peace Officers Memorial Day at Town Hall in recognition and remembrance of officers killed in the line of duty.



National Public Works Week

The City Council also issued a proclamation declaring the week of May 20 to 26 as National Public Works Week in Hillsborough to recognize the hardworking individuals of the Public Works Department and the important community impacts that their work has on a daily basis. The Public Works Department is responsible for the overall planning, maintenance, operation, and improvement of the public infrastructure, including streets, storm drainage, sewer and water.

Vice Mayor and Public Works Commissioner Shawn Christianson and Public Works Director Paul Willis presented the proclamation to Sewer Division Supervisor Robert Galindo, who accepted on the Department's behalf.



9th Annual Memorial Day Parade, Carnival and Music Festival

Memorial Day celebrations will be held on Monday, May 28, 2018, starting with the **PARADE** at 10:30 a.m. at Town Hall. Parade participants will line up beginning at 9:30 a.m. The route goes up Floribunda, left on Eucalyptus, finishing at North School. Hillsborough City School District's new Superintendent Louann Carlomagno will be the

parade announcer at the Floribunda circle and Larry Raffo is back as the announcer at North School. Hillsborough Police Chief Mark O'Connor will serve as the Grand Marshal.



Because of the positive reception of using Crocker field last year, the post parade festivities will be there again this year. The **OBSERVANCE CEREMONY** will begin right after the end of the parade at approximately 11:45 a.m. The **MUSIC FESTIVAL** will start immediately after that around noon.

[Eucalyptus Avenue Pathway Project Update](#)

Town staff provided an update to the City Council on the conceptual plan of a pathway, landscaped area and road improvements along the 500 to 700 block of Eucalyptus Avenue. The proposed project is a collaborative effort between the Town of Hillsborough, Hillsborough Beautification Foundation, and the Burlingame Country Club.

The City Council provided general direction on the project to staff moving forward. Numerous Hillsborough residents and students spoke about the project at the meeting and also through e-mails and telephone calls.
