

Risk Assessment Study Session

The City Council held a risk assessment study session with Town staff before the regularly scheduled Council meeting. Staff from all departments met over many months to conduct a Town-wide risk assessment, which is a comprehensive and systematic evaluation of risk factors that the Town may face. These factors can vary greatly and cover all aspects of city government operations including Information Technology (computers, phones, networks, servers), personnel (unavailability of key decision makers, retirements, cost of housing), economic and financial risks (recession, loss of revenue, tax reforms), and natural disasters/catastrophic events.

By identifying risks and setting plans in place, the Town can react faster to an event or loss by allowing staff to implement recovery strategies immediately.

No formal actions or adoptions were made during the study session. Risk assessment will be an ongoing process and staff will update the Council annually on its status.

Police Building Assessment

The City Council authorized an agreement with Indigo Hammond + Playle Architects, LLP (Indigo) to provide an assessment of the Hillsborough Police Department building, which was originally built in 1913 and has gone through numerous remodels. The age and small size of the building results in constant maintenance and repairs, and limits the availability of many critical rooms for the Police Department, such as interview, evidence processing, and training rooms.



The Town received a total of five proposals and determined Indigo to be the most qualified for the project. Indigo will be tasked with developing a thorough assessment to address the building's limitations, and provide guidance for either bringing the current building up to today's standards or considering a new building that would include the necessary facilities and engineering.

The total cost of the assessment is \$70,000 and includes a 10% or \$7,000 contingency. The assessment is expected to be completed by late 2018 or early 2019.
