HILLSBOROUGH CLOSE TO STATE WASTE DIVERSION GOAL

The City Council reported that Hillsborough reached a waste diversion rate of **74.5%** in 2018. Waste diversion calculates the amount of recyclable, reusable and compostable material that does not end up in landfills. Hillsborough is one of the few cities in California that is already close to meeting the state goal of a [75% waste diversion rate by 2020](#).

WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT AMENDED

The City Council authorized seven amendments to the Water Supply Agreement (WSA) between the City and County of San Francisco and wholesale customers in Alameda, San Mateo and Santa Clara Counties. The WSA was first authorized in 2009 and outlines the terms by which Hillsborough, as one of the 26 wholesale customers, will purchase water from the San Francisco Regional Water system.

Nicole Sandkulla, Chief Executive Officer and General Manager of the Bay Area Water Supply & Conservation Agency (BAWSCA), outlined the details of the seven amendments, which were identified as changes of the greatest importance to the 26 agencies.
