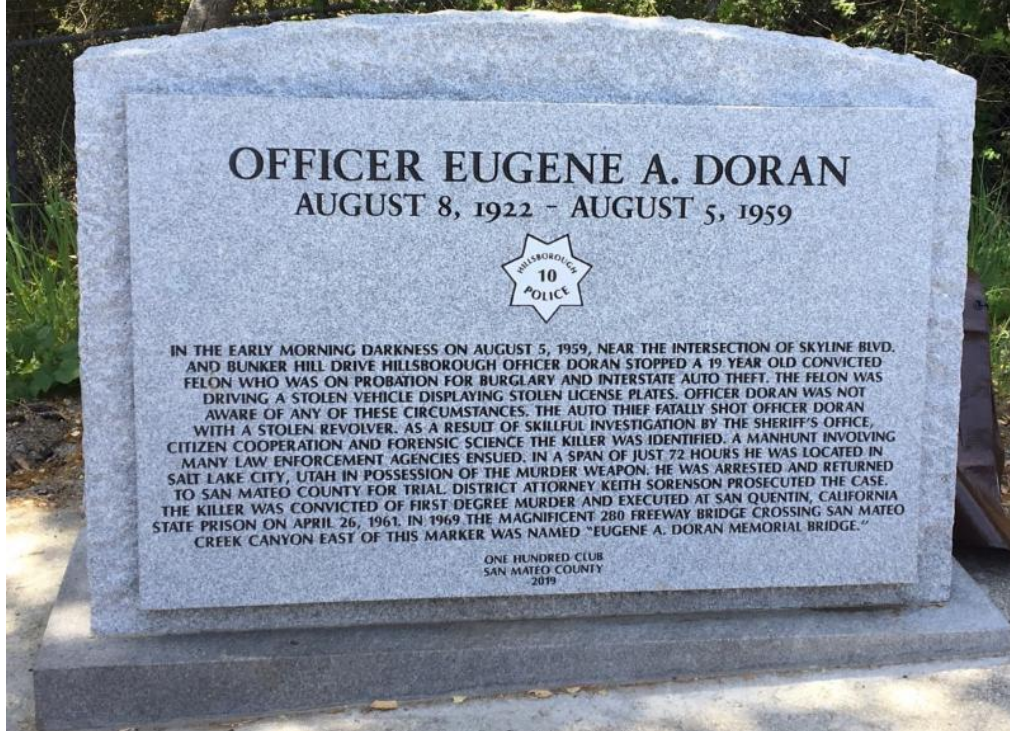
PEACE OFFICERS MEMORIAL DAY & NATIONAL POLICE WEEK



The Hillsborough Police Department (HPD) joined other departments in remembrance of the 28 officers who have fallen in the line of duty in San Mateo County for Peace Officers Memorial Day and National Police Week. HPD Officer Daryl Arceo honored Hillsborough Police Officer Eugene A. Doran with a rose at the ceremony. Officer Doran was killed in the line of duty on August 5, 1959.

A ceremony was held on May 13th at the Sawyer Camp Trail in San Mateo County to dedicate and unveil a new historical marker for Officer Doran. Bill Larsen, Chair of the Officer Doran Historical Marker Project and former San Mateo County District Attorney, made a presentation to the City Council about the historical marker and presented the Town with a framed copy of the program and marker to be displayed at Town Hall.

Councilmember and Police Commissioner Larry May presented Officer Arceo with a proclamation declaring National Police Week from May 12th to May 18th and Peace Officers Memorial Day on May 15th.

At the May 13th City Council Meeting, Mayor and Public Works Commissioner Shawn Christianson presented the Public Works Department with a proclamation declaring May 19th to May 25th as Public Works Week in Hillsborough.
