Attention small businesses: get ready to apply for a Small Business Grant

Applications for the [San Mateo County Strong Fund](#) are *projected* to go live early next week. Please start preparing your documents now.

Documentation is REQUIRED for all eligibility criteria

Required documents *may* include the ones listed below but please visit the San Mateo County Strong Fund site for more details and information.

- Valid business license
- Bank Statements
- Current Profit and Loss Statements
- IRS or FTB tax returns
- Proof of rent or mortgage, utility, healthcare premiums or payroll processing document

About the SMC Strong Small Business Grant Program

- Grants up to \$10,000
- Grants can pay for payroll, operations, ongoing expenses or other costs associated with COVID-19 impacts
- Eligibility criteria - documentation **REQUIRED** for all eligibility criteria
- You may qualify for this grant regardless of whether you applied for the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), Economic Disaster Impact Loan (EDIL) and/or other grants
- Available in English, Spanish and Chinese
- Applications *only* accepted online (to comply with physical distancing orders)
- No citizenship requirement

Used masks and gloves go in the trash!

What do you do with your used gloves, masks or other personal protective equipment (PPE)? **It should be thrown away in your garbage.** Do not discard your used PPE on the sidewalk or street for someone else to pick up. We're all in this shelter in place together, and one small gesture you can make to keep your neighborhood safe is to ensure your used PPE is properly discarded.



Need tips on safely removing your used gloves?

1. Pinch the outside of the glove about an inch or two down from the top edge inside the wrist.
2. Peel downwards, away from the wrist, turning the glove inside out

3. Pull the glove away until it's removed from the hand. Hold the inside-out glove with the gloved hand.
4. With your gloveless hand, slide your fingers under the wrist of the glove, do not touch the outside surface of the glove.
5. Repeat step 3. Peel downwards, away from the wrist, turning the glove inside out.
6. Continue pulling the glove down and over the first glove. This ensures that both gloves are inside out, one glove enveloped inside the other, with no contaminants on the bare hands.
7. Dispose of the gloves in a garbage bin.
