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## City Council Recap

The Hillsborough City Council held it's second virtual City Council meeting on Zoom this past Monday.



Rosanne Foust, President and CEO of the San Mateo County Economic Development Association (SAMCEDA) provided an update on SAMCEDA's ongoing efforts to aid residents and local businesses during the COVID-19 pandemic. The City Council also adopted a resolution pledging \$20,000 towards the San Mateo County Strong (SMCStrong) Fund from the Town's unrestricted General Fund. The Town receives \$100,000 annually as its per capita share of sales and use tax that is generated by business activity in the County and a donation of funds to support business activity would benefit the Town and its residents. Since the fund was established, there have been more than 1,000 donors have contributed a total of \$8.2 million to the San Mateo County Strong Fund, which provides grants to individuals and families, small businesses and nonprofit groups impacted by COVID-19. 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## Meals available for delivery to elderly residents Monday to Saturday

Older residents at high risk from COVID-19 can receive three nutritious meals per day (Monday - Saturday) delivered to their home from restaurants and other food providers across San Mateo County, helping them stay home and stay healthy. The program also provides an avenue for local food services and providers to continue operations and maintain their employees, softening the losses felt by the COVID crisis.



Local restaurants, caterers and food providers are strongly encouraged to apply immediately for the program, titled 'Great Plates Delivered SMC', and administered by County Health.
