Recology to resume Bulky Item Collection Program

Recology San Mateo County will be reinstating the Bulky Item Collection (BIC) Program beginning **Monday, May 4th**. This decision was made after reviewing the updated Shelter in Place order from the County of San Mateo, which includes the easing of some restrictions, such as construction and outdoor business activities. Recology Customer Service Representatives (CSRs) will contact the original customers who were put on a priority waitlist when their previously scheduled BIC was put on hold. CSRs will also contact the additional customers who requested a BIC after the suspension of the program and were put on a separate waitlist. These two lists total approximately 1,500 customers. All new requests for BICs will be scheduled beginning the week of May 11th, unless space is available sooner.

Although the [Shoreway Environmental Center's Transfer Station](#) will resume operations on Monday, the Public Recycling Center will remain closed for the time being as RethinkWaste evaluates alternative options for the popular service that complies with the latest order.

Cash payments will be accepted on **Monday, May 4th from 9:00am to 5:00pm** at the following locations:

- 555 County Center, Redwood City
- 537 Kelly Street, Half Moon Bay (closed Noon to 1:00pm)
- 1024 Mission Road, South San Francisco (closed Noon to 12:30pm)

When making cash payments, please wear a face covering and abide by social distancing requirements.

Sheltering the homeless key to stopping spread of coronavirus

A Peninsula hotel now serves as the temporary home for homeless people as the County of San Mateo seeks to prevent a surge in coronavirus cases among a community at higher risk.



The County has secured at least 60 rooms at what is being called [Bayfront Station](#) as temporary housing for homeless individuals who have no home to shelter in place. This is the first hotel to open for this purpose in San Mateo County and is a result of a collaboration between the County, the hotel owner and [Samaritan House](#), which operates the site under contract with the County.
