Bay Area health orders remain in effect

The Bay Area Health Officers commend the residents and businesses who have made tremendous sacrifices to flatten the curve and protect community health in our region. We need to continue to work together so those sacrifices don't go to waste. It is critical to maintain our gains.



Yesterday, Governor Gavin Newsom [issued guidance](#) that spells out the state's expectations for non-essential businesses to begin to reopen in a limited capacity. The County will study this carefully.

It is important that our local communities understand that the regional health orders that took effect May 4th are still in effect. These orders – in Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, San Mateo and Santa Clara counties and the City of Berkeley – loosen restrictions on construction as well as outdoor activities and businesses. The Bay Area orders do not currently permit curbside pickup from non-essential, non-outdoor businesses, and that is not allowed to begin today.

The Bay Area Health Officers will continue to study the indicators that tell us how the coronavirus is affecting our communities and amend the health orders as warranted in the best interest of community health. We share the urgency to reopen and restore our economies and our normal activities, and the equal importance of doing so in a way that is safe, responsible and does not cause a significant increase in serious illness and death, or overwhelm our healthcare delivery systems.
