### Allowed Indoors

- ▶ Hair, nail, body waxing salons
- ▶ Restaurants at 25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is fewer
- ▶ Places of worship at 25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is fewer
- ▶ Museums, Zoos & Aquariums at 25% capacity
- ▶ Movie theaters at 25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is fewer
- ▶ Gyms & Fitness Centers at 10% capacity
- ▶ Malls can increase capacity to 50%

### Not Currently Allowed to Resume Operation

- ▶ Bars, Breweries & Distilleries



Counties can move to a less restrictive level as COVID transmission goes down and testing goes up.

Stay diligent about keeping your distance, wearing your mask, getting tested, and following all protocols and directives.

### County moves into red/substantial tier

Effective immediately, San Mateo County has been moved to the second tier (red) under California's four-tiered, color-coded system known as the [Blueprint for a Safer Economy](#). Certain health and safety restrictions are eased in the second tier as noted in the graphic above.

Still, the County's new risk level is considered "substantial" under the State's monitoring system and County Health officials caution that businesses and individuals must continue to follow health and safety guidelines. San Mateo County's [health order](#) requiring face coverings, social distancing, and limited gatherings remains in effect.

## Elections 2020 - What you need to know

The November 3, 2020 Presidential Election is approaching. All registered voters will be automatically mailed a ballot to their residence beginning October 5th. You may cast your ballot during the 29-day period prior to Election Day and on Election Day via a ballot drop box or by mail or vote in person. Here are some helpful tips to make sure your vote counts:



### 1. Register

- Register to vote or update your registration information at [www.registertovote.ca.gov](http://www.registertovote.ca.gov)
- Already registered? Check to make sure it is current at <https://voterstatus.sos.ca.gov>
- Last day to register to vote is October 19<sup>th</sup>.

### 2. Track your Ballot

- Ballots are mailed beginning October 5<sup>th</sup>.
- Sign up for ballot tracking at <https://california.ballottrax.net/voter>. This will let you know when your ballot is mailed, received by the County, and counted!

### 3. Drop off your Ballot

- Drop off your ballot at any voting location and participating jurisdiction office before 8 pm on Election Day and it will be counted. For vote center locations: [www.smcacre.org/vote-center-locations](http://www.smcacre.org/vote-center-locations).
- Drop your ballot in any of the County Elections Office's 24/7 outdoor ballot drop boxes. Locations include:
  - Town of Hillsborough Parking Lot (next to mailbox), 1600 Floribunda Avenue (pictured above)
  - Burlingame City Hall, 501 Primrose Road
  - Burlingame Recreation Center (near portable), 1010 Burlingame Avenue
  - Burlingame School District Office, 1825 Trousdale Drive
  - San Mateo County Elections Office, 40 Tower Road, San Mateo

### 4. Mail your Ballot

- You do not need to place any stamps on the ballot return envelope. The postage has

been paid by the County Elections Office.

- Ballots must be received by the County Elections Office by 8 pm on Election Day or be postmarked on or before Election Day and received within 17 days after Election Day.

**5. Vote in Person (Vote Early or on Election Day)**

- Vote in Person at Hillsborough Town Hall, 1600 Floribunda Avenue
- Saturday, October 31st through Monday, November 2nd: 9:00am – 5:00pm
- Election Day, Tuesday, November 3rd: 7:00am – 8:00pm
