Face coverings required as of April 22nd at 8:00am - graphics and posters

San Mateo County Health [issued a new health order](#) last Friday requiring members of the public and workers at essential businesses to wear face coverings outside the home for certain activities and in places of business.

In addition to a [face covering FAQ page](#), the County also has created a series of [signs for essential businesses](#) to post and share.

Factory-made or improvised from ordinary household materials, face coverings are defined as any type of cloth, fabric, or other soft material that covers only the nose and mouth and surrounding areas of the lower face. Scarves, bandanas, neck gaiters, homemade coverings made from t-shirt material or other fabric and held with rubber bands are appropriate. Purchased masks may also be used but should not be medical grade, such as N95 respirators, which are in short supply and prioritized for health care workers.



WEAR IT CLOTH FACE COVERING*

WEAR IN PUBLIC SETTINGS
where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain

FIT SNUGLY BUT COMFORTABLY
against the side of the face

INCLUDE
multiple layers of fabric

SECURE
with ties or ear loops

LAUNDRER AND MACHINE DRY
without damage or change to shape

ROUTINELY WASH
depending on the frequency of use

WASH HANDS
immediately after removing

DO NOT TOUCH
eyes, nose, and mouth when removing a face covering



* Surgical masks or N-95 respirators must continue to be reserved for healthcare workers and other medical first responders.
