### WASTE REDUCTION PLAN PACKET

The information provided in this document is general and intended for general guidance. Each project is unique and additional requirements may be required and/or enforced as deemed appropriate, refer to the applicable code for specific requirements.

The Town of Hillsborough passed a Recycling Resolution requiring Waste Reduction Plans for all construction and demolition projects. Please read the attached documentation carefully and use the checklist below to ensure compliance.

### CHECKLIST

- Complete and submit the Waste Reduction Plan form** (labeled "REQUIRED PRIOR TO PERMIT") before pulling your permit.
- After obtaining permit, arrange for the thorough deconstruction and salvage of reusable items** in advance of demolition, if applicable, and have your salvage service provider write a letter outlining the types and quantities of materials salvaged. If you are not familiar with deconstruction and salvage service providers, see the attached list of companies that work locally.
- If you decide to use a debris box, use a service provider that is franchised to haul materials generated in Hillsborough** (see attached list).
- Separate the debris material(s) you will be generating the most of** (e.g., scrap wood, concrete) in order to facilitate recycling, and haul to the recycling facilities on your approved Waste Reduction Plan.
- Take mixed debris to the approved recycling facility on your Waste Reduction Plan.**
- Complete the Diversion Summary Sheet (labeled "REQUIRED PRIOR TO FINAL INSPECTION") and attach weight tickets** to document compliance when your job is complete, BUT BEFORE YOUR FINAL INSPECTION. Final inspections will not be completed until all recycling documentation is submitted.

C&D Summary

### CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION WASTE REDUCTION

The information provided in this document is general and intended for general guidance. Each project is unique and additional requirements may be required and/or enforced as deemed appropriate, refer to the applicable code for specific requirements.

Hillsborough is required by State Law to divert 65% of its waste from landfill (or not exceed an equivalent per capita disposal target). To meet this goal, the Town requires applicants for demolition and building permits to submit a Waste Reduction Plan (“Plan”) for review and approval. Where a contractor will demolish a home and construct a new one, a separate Plan is required for each project. The Plan will demonstrate how the contractor will maximize the reuse and/or recycling of materials generated during demolition, new construction, roofing, landscape and other construction projects.

#### **DECONSTRUCTION AND SALVAGE**

Where a structure is to be partially or wholly demolished, *deconstruction and salvaging of materials should take place*. Basic salvage of easily removed, valuable appliances and fixtures almost always happens before a demolition. However, deconstruction companies go much farther, removing lumber, flooring, brick and many other materials for reuse before the house is demolished. These companies may work with your demolition contractor or provide full deconstruction and demolition services. In some cases, the homeowner may be able to write-off the fair market value of the salvaged items. Please consult the list of service providers attached.

Hillsborough recognizes that the more time a deconstruction company is given, the more they can salvage. Upon obtaining written approval from the Town, applicants may perform non-structural deconstruction and salvage for reuse before a demolition permit is issued. Structural deconstruction may only begin upon issuance of a demolition permit. The contractor is responsible for providing sufficient time for deconstruction organizations to maximize their salvage efforts. Work hours for deconstruction and salvaging are the same as for other construction activities.

#### **SOURCE SEPARATION AND MIXED DEBRIS**

Separating into clean loads those materials that cannot be salvaged will facilitate their recycling, and is strongly encouraged. For example, on-site separation of scrap wood during construction of a house should be undertaken where feasible. Recycling facilities often accept source-separated materials at a lower fee than mixed debris. Be sure to label your containers and educate your subcontractors to ensure clean, source-separated loads. General contractors should consider inserting recycling language into their sub-contracts that reflects the Town’s C&D recycling requirements.

*If you intend to haul mixed debris (e.g., Acceptable Loads: metals, wood, gypsum wallboard, tiles, etc.), it must be hauled to the facility on your approved Waste Reduction Plan that can process and recycle mixed debris. Materials that have been source separated at the job site and contain very little or no contamination do not necessarily have to be hauled to a mixed debris recycling facility, but must be hauled to the facility (or facilities) indicated on your approved Waste Reduction Plan.* Please refer to the attached list of approved mixed debris recycling facilities in developing your Plan.

#### **DEBRIS BOXES**

*If you will require debris box service, you may only use a debris box company permitted by the Town.* These companies have agreements with the Town to recycle materials hauled from within Hillsborough Town limits. Please refer to the attached list of permitted debris box companies.

#### **DOCUMENTATION**

**Demolition Projects.** The Building Inspector may verify the removal of salvaged materials prior to demolition. Once demolition is complete, the contractor will submit the attached Diversion Summary Sheet with: 1) a list of items salvaged for reuse, and 2) all facility weight tickets showing the date, project address, quantity, type and disposition of the remaining materials that were hauled from the job site. The Building Inspector will verify that the recycling goals of the Plan were documented and met *before a construction permit will be issued.*

**Construction Projects.** A Waste Reduction Plan must be submitted and approved *before a construction permit will be issued.* Upon completion of the project, the contractor will complete and submit the attached Diversion Summary Sheet with weight tickets showing the date, project address, quantity, type and disposition of all materials that were hauled from the job site. Review and approval of all waste reduction documentation is required before scheduling a final inspection.

### PROJECT MID-POINT HANDOUT

The information provided in this document is general and intended for general guidance. Each project is unique and additional requirements may be required and/or enforced as deemed appropriate, refer to the applicable code for specific requirements.

Before a Hillsborough Building Department Final Inspection is granted, contractors must demonstrate compliance with the Town's Construction & Demolition Debris (C&D) Recycling Ordinance #628. Contractors must:

1. Provide all original receipts (e.g., weight tickets) from the facilities to which project debris was hauled. If debris boxes were used, contact the debris box company to have copies of all weight tickets sent to the contractor or to the Town's Recycling Specialist. Debris box companies may fax or email receipts to the Recycling Specialist at 650-375-7411 or [plancheck@hillsborough.net](mailto:plancheck@hillsborough.net).  
If applicable, provide salvage documentation in the form of a letter and materials list from the service provider(s). Photos may also be provided as supporting evidence that salvaging was performed.
2. Complete a *Diversion Summary Sheet*. If multiple projects are involved, recycling and disposal receipts must be associated with the correct Waste Reduction Plan and permit.
3. Organize and attach all receipts in chronological order.
4. Submit all documents to the Recycling Specialist at the Town of Hillsborough Building Department, 1600 Floribunda Ave., Hillsborough, CA 94010. Be sure to keep copies for your records.
5. Verify compliance with the Recycling Specialist. Once verified, bring your *Yellow Field Card* to the Building Department for the Recycling Specialist to sign.
6. Schedule a Final Inspection by calling 650-375-7411.

**Contractors must account for all construction and demolition debris that leaves their job sites (whether salvaged, recycled or disposed). This includes all debris hauled by subcontractors.**

**The Building Department's final inspection process will not be completed until all documentation has been submitted and compliance with the C&D recycling requirements has been verified by the Town's Recycling Specialist.**
