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STREET PRESERVATION FEE

The Town of Hillsborough implemented a new Street Preservation Fee in July 2013. The purpose of the fee is to cover the cost to repair roadway damage caused by excavation for the development of private property, utility trenches and/or other pavement cuts:

The fee is determined and assessed by the following steps and formula shown below:

1. Input the linear footage of construction activities along the street x 22' (the average street width in Hillsborough) to determine the square footage.
2. Divide the square footage by 9 to determine the square yardage.
3. Multiply the square yardage by \$4 to determine the fee.

$$\text{Street Preservation Fee} = \left(\frac{\text{Linear Footage} \times 22}{9} \right) \times \$4.00$$

Examples:

- A. Replacement of 16' of curb: $16' \times 22' = 352 \text{ ft}^2 / 9 = 39.10 \times \$4.00 = \$156.40$
- B. 6'x6' excavation in the street: $6' \times 22' = 132 \text{ ft}^2 / 9 = 14.70 \times \$4.00 = \$58.80$

All of the funds collected will be dedicated to street preservation. City Council has determined that this level of funding is appropriate in order to ensure the integrity of the Town's roadways and aesthetic values are preserved.
