UNAPPROVED MINUTES MONDAY, JULY 11, 2022 6:00 PM CITY COUNCIL MEETING Hillsborough Town Hall and Zoom Video Conference

This City Council meeting was conducted pursuant to the provisions of Assembly Bill 361 and Government Code Section 54953(e) (and without compliance with section 54953(b)(3)) related to conducting public meetings during the COVID-19 pandemic. The City Council, staff and members of the public participated in the meeting virtually via Zoom Video Conference or in person at Town Hall.

I. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Royse called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

II. ROLL CALL

III. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Scouts BSA Troop 42 and 4042 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Royse announced that Item 12, the Public Hearing for Conceptual Review of the Subdivision of 85 Fagan Drive and Adjacent Vacant Lot (APN 027-330-630) into Three Parcels and Dedication of Public Right-of-Way, had been pulled from the agenda at the recommendation of staff and will be discussed at a future City Council meeting. Mayor Royse stated members of the public may provide comments during the Public Comment on non-agenda items.

IV. MINUTES: June 13, 2022

Mayor Royse opened public comment. There were no speakers. Mayor Royse closed public comment.

On motion by Councilmember Chuang, seconded by Councilmember Cole and unanimous roll call vote with Councilmember May absent, the minutes of the June 13, 2022 City Council meeting were approved as amended on page two to reflect that Councilmember May read the proclamation in recognition of June 19, 2022 as Juneteenth.

V. PRESENTATION

- PRESENTATION BY BILL CHIANG, LOCAL GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS, PG&E

Bill Chiang, Local Government Affairs, PG&E, provided a presentation on the Community Wildfire Safety Program and responded to questions. Cindy Mama and Jeff Wilson, Project Managers, PG&E Gas-Strength Testing Group, provided additional information. Public Works Director Paul Willis provided comments.

Mayor Royse stated that without objection of the City Council, Mayor's Applause would be moved up on the agenda and heard immediately following this item.

Mayor Royse opened public comment.

Tom Kasten stated that the PG&E lines in his neighborhood are underground and inquired as to why they frequently use-lose power with no plausible explanation, inquired about the coverage with the current placement of high-definition cameras, and inquired about how often the gas transmission pipeline near his home is tested.
